ANATOMY OF A TURBO TUBE

You'll hear us mention "turbo tube" often. You may wonder what on Earth we're talking about. Well, let us explain.

Turbo tube is really just a fun way of saying "climate controlled greenhouse." They're nothing crazy, they don't take flight (knock on wood with these wild winds we've been having). We use passive techniques to heat and cool the houses most of the year, but we have a couple extra bells and whistles to keep us growing year-round.



Exhaust fans push hot air out of the greenhouse to assist in cooling the space, as well as adding humidity. Light traps on the fans keep light from entering the house when blackout tarps are tricking the plants into producing flowers.

Greenhouse plastics diffuse light, keep the greenhouse nice and warm, and protect the plants from wind and other elements.

Large fans distribute the cool air from the wet walls throughout the rest of the greenhouse.

Propane heaters allow us to heat the greenhouses in cold or freezing weather, allowing us to grow for a larger portion of the year.

The greenhouse version of a swamp cooler, wet walls are plumbed to let water drain down corrugated cardboard panels. When air is sucked through these panels, the water cools the air.

T-Posts are ready for trellis, which will support the plants' heavy branches as they grow and flower.



Drip irrigation allows the plants to get small amounts of water throughout the day, offering a more efficient solution to watering.
